

Census Bureau Releases 2021 ACS, Income, and Poverty Data

The U.S. Census Bureau has released the <u>2021 Income</u>, <u>Poverty</u> <u>and Health Insurance statistics</u> from the <u>Current Population</u> <u>Survey</u> Annual Social/Economic Supplement and the <u>American</u> <u>Community Survey</u> (ACS):

 National 2021 Income statistics: Annual release of estimates on income, earnings and inequality in order to evaluate national economic trends and to understand their effect on the well-being of households and individuals.



- National 2021 Poverty statistics: Annual release of official poverty and Supplemental Poverty Measure estimates to help understand the economic wellbeing of households, families and individuals based on national poverty rates and SPM rates for the nation and states.
- 2021 American Community Survey: Statistics on numerous demographic, social, economic and housing characteristics (including language spoken at home, educational attainment, commute to work, employment, mortgage status and rent, as well as income, poverty and health insurance coverage) will be available for geographic areas with populations of 65,000+.
- 2021 American Community Survey Data Profiles, Detailed Tables, Comparison Profiles, Selected Population Profiles, Subject Tables and Summary File.

Grants & Deadlines

October 4 <u>FY22 Railroad Crossing Elimination Grant Program</u>. The purpose of the RCE Program is to provide funding for highway-rail and pathway-rail grade crossing improvement projects that focus on improving the safety and mobility of people and goods.

October 5 <u>Infrastructure and Capacity Building Challenge Grants</u>. This National Endowment for the Humanities program is to strengthen the institutional base of the humanities by enabling infrastructure development and capacity building. Awards of federal matching funds for capitol projects and digital infrastructure.

October 6 <u>National Archives</u> deadline for the following grant programs: <u>Public</u> <u>Engagement with Historical Records</u>; <u>Archival Projects</u>; and <u>Publishing Historical</u> <u>Records in Documentary Editions</u>.

October 7 <u>Community Wildfire Defense Grant 2022 Northeast-Midwes</u>tassists at-risk local communities and Indian Tribes with planning and mitigating against the risk created by wildfire, prioritizing at-risk communities in an area with high wildfire hazard potential, are low-income, and/or have been impacted by a severe disaster.

October 10 <u>NRCS Wetland Mitigation Banking Program</u> for the development and establishment of mitigation banks and banking opportunities solely for agricultural producers with wetlands subject to the wetland conservation compliance provisions of the Food Security Act of 1985.

October 11 <u>NRCS Conservation Innovation Grants</u> is a competitive program that supports the development of new tools, approaches, practices, and technologies to further natural resource conservation on private lands.

October 13 <u>Reconnecting Communities Pilot Program: Planning Grants and Capital</u> <u>Construction Grants</u>. USDOT funding to reconnect communities that were previously cut off from economic opportunities by transportation infrastructure. Funding supports planning grants and capital construction grants, and technical assistance.

October 18 Healthy Homes Production Grant Program takes a comprehensive

approach to addressing multiple childhood diseases and injuries in the home by focusing on housing-related hazards in a coordinated fashion, rather than addressing a single hazard at a time.
